1. Read Genesis 2:15-25 and describe your thoughts about the following:

 - * Adam's response in verse 23 -
 - * The whole *one flesh* concept in verse 24 -
 - * How it must have felt to be naked and unashamed -
2. Why do you think the serpent slithered Eve's way when the Bible clearly says that Adam was with her and what do you think Eve (and Adam) should have done differently? (Genesis 3:1-7)

3. How does James 1:13-15 relate to Genesis 3:1-7? (pay specific attention to verse 6)

4. Explain how Romans 6:23 correlate with God's command and warning to Adam in Genesis 2:15-17?

5. Sarah was guilty of not guarding her heart... but so was Adam. What are some ways you can guard your heart from the things you are most tempted by?

6. In Genesis 3:2-3 Sarah added to God's Word and made it say something that He didn't say. Read Isaiah 28:10 and Deuteronomy 12:32. How can those verses help you guard your heart?

7. Other than the ultimate consequence of death, we read about some other consequences to their sin Genesis 3:14-20. List them in the space provided below their names:
