- 1. To really understand the relationship between Isaac and Rebekah, a little look at their introduction is in order. **Read Genesis 24:37-66 and describe your thoughts about the following:**
 - · The way Rebekah responded to Abraham's servant -
 - · God's obvious and in the details of their marriage -
 - How different our culture is from theirs and how you think you would have responded if you were Rebekah -
- 2. Genesis 24:67 (NKJV) tells us, "Then Isaac brought her into his mother Sarah's tent; and he took Rebekah and she became his wife, and he loved her. So Isaac was comforted after his mother's death." Sarah died 3 years before the marriage between Isaac and Rebekah. What does the fact that Isaac mourned for his mother for three years tell us about the relationship Isaac had with his mother?



Genesis 25:28 says, "And Isaac loved Esau because he ate of his game, but Rebekah loved Jacob."
What are some attitudes or characteristics that Esau and Jacob might have because their parents played favorites?

4. Read Genesis 27:5-14 and write out what Rebekah's 1st, 2nd, and 3rd mistakes were in order.

5. Based on Genesis 27:5-14, what did Rebekah teach her son to do?

6. Galatians 6:7 tells us, "Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows." Read Genesis 29:18-27 and describe how the reaping and sowing principle of Scripture is demonstrated to be true in Jacob's life?

7. Reminiscent of the account of Abraham and Sarah in Genesis 12:11-3, we find Isaac asking Rebekah to tell the men in Gerar that she was his sister in Genesis 26:6-7. Above, we just read where Rebekah taught her son to lie. Looks a lot like the whole, "Life parent, like child" thing going on there, doesn't it? How can parents avoid passing on our propensities towards certain sins to our children?





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8. According to Genesis 25:21, Rebekah was barren. Are there any areas of barrenness in your life? If so, take a moment and list them below.

9. What lessons have you learned from Rebekah's life that can challenge and change yours?
